Puberty

Objective:

- This lesson is meant to precede the school presentation to the children about puberty.
- The idea is to complete the truth for the children by teaching them that God is involved in their development.
- He develops their bodies and souls ONLY to live in purity and godliness and glorify His name.
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Memory Verse

“So, God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.” (Genesis 1:27)

Lesson Outline:

First Session:

Using the creation story to illustrate that God is in charge of their development.

- Today, we are going to begin by reading about the creation of Adam and Eve. We'll see that God created us humans in His own image. He used His own hands and fashioned our bodies out of dust then breathed into us. “And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and man became a living being.” Genesis 2:7 After God had already created light and separated it from darkness, then formed the heavens, the seas, the sun, the moon, and the stars; He created the plants and trees to cover the earth. He then created all living beings, such as birds, fish and all types of animals. God's last creation was Man. Let's read Genesis 1:24-29.
- This passage shows us that Man was created in God's image and in His likeness. Next, let's look at Genesis 2:7-9. In these verses, we see that God made Adam out of the ground and literally breathed life into him. All that God had created was good. But God noticed that Adam did not have a companion. In Genesis 2:21-25, we read about the creation of Eve who came from Adam's rib. In Genesis 3, we see that Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate from the fruit of the tree, which God commanded them not to eat from.
- As a result, in verse 7, the Bible says, “Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked, and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings”. Before Adam and Eve sinned, they were not ashamed of their nakedness. They were pure in heart and mind; their eyes also were pure and they respected each other's bodies. The Bible tells us that God would walk in the garden and would talk to Adam and Eve.

- This shows us that they also had a very close relationship with God. But after they sinned, they felt ashamed and hid from God. They also made clothing to cover their bodies. And they did not have the same type of relationship anymore.
- This is how things have been since sin entered the world. Through our Lord Jesus, we are able to remain pure in heart, mind, and eyes. From reading about the creation story, we notice that God is the one who is in charge of creating things. He is also in charge of developing all things that He created. Also notice that as opposed to everything else, He created us humans by His own hand, He fashioned our bodies and souls to be in His likeness and image. He is also the one that develops our bodies during puberty.
- Puberty is that specific age where God decides that your body and mind will start to develop and start maturing until you are transformed from being a child to a fully blossomed adult. When you will take this lesson of puberty and physical development of your body in school, you may not hear anything about God, the creator of your body! Isn't that weird? Let me ask you this question.
- If you prepared the greatest project for school, is it right that someone takes it and presents it the whole school as if it was his own and not attributing it to you? Of course not! That would be wrong and unfair. Let me ask you a follow-up question. What if after making your project you developed and updated it for a very good purpose like helping people and making everyone happy. Then someone took it and started to use this developed updated version for an evil purpose, what do you think of that? Of course, that would be sinful and evil.
- The same applies to your body that God will be actively working in developing it during puberty and the years of adolescence, for glorifying Him by good deeds. But Satan will try to convince you that he is the one working in it. Please be reminded and alert of the fact that Satan is a liar and a murderer. (John 8: 44).
- Our bodies are godly and holy, in fact, we were created in the image of God Himself. As Christ-followers, we are the children of light and we are pure. Satan tries his best to get us in trouble by tempting us as he did with Adam and Eve. He wants us to disobey God. He often uses the media, classmates or anyone else to take our purity away with ungodly thoughts and actions. He often tells us things like "It's not a big deal - everyone else is doing it". Or "I have to do this if I want to be popular". Satan's goal is to make you forget that your body is God's creation and to make you think that it has nothing to do with God. Then he will invite you to use it to destroy yourself and others. But we need to fight back and hold tight to our purity. How can we do that? We need to be prepared!
- Let's find out how to be prepared. First, I want to ask you some questions. Can a soldier fight in a war without his weapon? No. Can a teacher teach in class without having knowledge? No. And can a fisherman catch fish without a rod or net? Of course not.
- So, for us to be prepared, we need two things:
 - A spiritual plan
 - An educational plan.
- First, let's talk about having a spiritual plan. Ephesians 6:10-13 talks about the armor of God. We are to put on not just part of the armor, but the whole armor of God. That armor will allow us to stand up to Satan and the temptations he throws at us. Like we said before, Satan uses all sorts of tricks to get us to sin. His goal is to cause us to sin and then to be so discouraged that we give up trying to be pure. But we know that if we are truly sorry for our actions, we can pray and ask God to forgive us. If we repent, God is

merciful and loving and grants us forgiveness.

- So, our spiritual plan is to put on the armor of God so we can be protected against Satan's attacks. What about the educational plan? Knowledge gives us power. And 1 Corinthians 2:16 says that we have the mind of Christ.
- We need to fill our minds with God's word, which helps us know the difference between right and wrong. During this phase of your life, we as Sunday school servants know that you are growing and changing, and we want to help you through these changes. As we said before, puberty can be a bit confusing if you don't know what to expect. So, you need to have the right information. But you also need to realize that not everyone has the correct information. Your parents and Sunday school servants are good people to ask if you have questions. Your school friends are probably not an accurate source for correct information. Please remember that you can come to us with questions and we will do our best to help guide you.
- So, at this time of your life, you're considered "a tween". You're no longer a kid, but you're not quite an adult yet. You're in between stages and your body is starting to go through many changes. In the next few years, you'll be making lots of tough choices, which can affect you in many ways.
- The good news is that all these changes you are going through are normal and handled by God's own hidden hands. Not only that, but these are among the healthiest years of your life. It's important to remember that God is in charge of all the changes you are going through. This includes how your mind is growing, how your body is changing and how your feelings might be different than before. The best news is that even though you are changing, you are still YOU. Puberty and adolescence are normal stages of life that every child goes through. God created your body to work according to His plan. Your growing and changing body might be a mystery to you, but not to God, He designed it very carefully. We, humans, are the most amazing creation of God, and the Bible tells us that we were wonderfully made according to His likeness and image.

Quick break

- Let's review some of the physical changes you might be going through.
- During puberty, you should expect to grow in your height and weight.
- The skin on your face may change and not be as clear as before.
- You might be extra tired and feel like you need to sleep more.
- You also might be hungrier than before. From His great love and care, God has prepared a specific hormone (a chemical in your body) called Estrogen, which is responsible for your growth as a girl to be a young lady and blossom to be a fully mature adult in the near future.
- These specific body changes are the following:
 - 1. Breast development begins between 8 and 13 years of age and continues through puberty.
 - 2. The growth of pubic hair starts between 8 and 14 years of age and continues through puberty, the hair becomes darker and coarser and grows like an inverted triangle.
 - 3. Growth spurt and weight gain are perfectly normal. Without gaining this weight, you cannot grow taller and develop the female body.

- 4. Underarm hair begins to grow about 2 years after pubic hair shows up.
- 5. Development of sweat glands which increases sweating. (This requires frequent baths and attention to personal hygiene)
- 6. Acne: Small pimples may appear in the face due to clogging of sweat gland, this needs face washing with lukewarm water twice daily. Avoid touching them to avoid infection.
- 7. Menstruation: Two years or so after your breasts start to probably get your first period that usually lasts about 2-8 days and comes every 21 to 35 days. A 28-day cycle is common however, it takes a while before your periods are regular.
 - This is briefly how it works: Each month, the lining of your uterus thickens with blood, that lining sheds off every month and blood comes out of your private parts. Please don't be scared, this is perfectly normal and all women you know have gone through it safely. Only 2-3 tablespoons of blood are released during your period, but it can seem like a lot more. You have to use special pads during this time; your mom or female servant can help you choose the most suitable brand for your body. Don't worry, all the girls your age and up will be using them! Remember, personal hygiene is extremely important.
- 8. Vaginal discharge: You may notice white, sticky stuff in your underpants. That's the fluid that keeps your private parts moist and clean. Vaginal discharge may become thicker and stickier at some points during your menstrual cycle. It has a slight odor, but most people can't smell it. Bathing regularly with soap can help reduce the odor. If your private parts become itchy or the discharge has a strong odor or is dark yellow or greenish, you may have an infection and you need to see your doctor.

Quick break!

Remember these very important points about your physical development:

1. Each one of you will go through these changes at different times and rates So, don't worry if you are growing quicker or slower than others. God's timing for you is perfect.
2. These changes are performed by God's blessing and hidden hand that works inside of your body.
3. It is for a great cause, and that is, developing you as His mature young man/lady representing Him amongst other humans that may not know Him.
4. Therefore, these changes are very holy and are preparing you to be God's Holy man/lady in the near future.
5. These changes should not be a subject for worldly exploration or ungodly discussions.
6. Be specifically careful from watching any ungodly videos or images that can destroy God's beautiful image in your mind.
7. Be very careful not to engage in any inappropriate exploratory touching whether of your own private organs or those of others that can turn into ungodly habits.
8. If you by any chance fall into any of the above-mentioned ungodly habits, please consult with your father of confession as early as possible to help you get rid of them through the grace of God.

Conclusion

- Today, we reviewed how God created everything, and that He created the first humans with His own hands at His likeness and image. Today, He is about to work in your holy body and develop it to become a blossomed adult to glorify His name. It is our duty to keep our bodies pure for Him. After Adam and Eve sinned, all people had to deal with temptation. We must consciously work hard to keep ourselves pure. We can keep our bodies pure by being prepared.
- This includes putting on the armor of God and having the mind of Christ. We can stay on course by keeping God's commandments and staying away from people, things, places or situations that tempt us
- Remember, knowledge is power, so reach out to trusted adults, such as your father of confession, parents, and Sunday school teachers about any questions you may have.
- That is why we had you and your parents here today. Don't be afraid to ask any questions that you may have and we will answer them with the truth of God. We want you to be informed with correct information so that you have an understanding and are not confused.
- Please do not rely on the TV, movies, the Internet or magazines for information.
- Remember, all the changes you are going through are normal and you are not alone. God loves you and has a special plan just for you.

Let me grow

Objective

To help girls understand the concept of purity and worth in Christ.

Memory Verse

"Do not stir up nor awaken love. Until it pleases" (Song of Solomon 2:7).

"Listen, O daughter, Consider and incline your ear; Forget your own people also, and your father's house; So, the King will greatly desire your beauty; Because He is your Lord, worship Him. The royal daughter is all glorious within the palace, Her clothing is woven with gold. She shall be brought to the King in robes of many colors" (Psalm 45:10-14)

"I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, and that my soul knows very well" (Psalm 139:14)

Introduction

(Background Research for Servants)

Things to keep in mind when preparing for a lesson but not to be included in the lesson.

Hormones are tiny chemicals in a female body that cause these changes during this age:

- Breast development
- Body and Pubic Hair growth
- Menstruation or "Period" – why do we bleed?
- Body Odor
- Widening of the hips
- Self-consciousness
- Moods and rages

1. God's Plan for Purity:

- Men and women were created to live a holy life, glorify His name and bear children that also glorify His name.
- God created our organs to glorify Him and to develop unity in a MARRIED couple. It is part of the marriage relationship designed to bring them closer. The bond of marriage is responsibility and love.
- It is a profound mystery, beautiful to understand. God's love for the church is like the love of a man to his wife; protective, unified and sacrificial.

2. How does the Devil mess it up?

- The holy, sanctified and the lifelong relationship of marriage according to God's design has been transformed into a casual, temporary and self-serving relationship.

- Satan took this holy union and said it is just an expression of love and any two who love each other are allowed to practice it.
- He convinces people it is a basic need of the body and a natural thing to happen.
- Encourage all movies, games, cartoons and everything around us to point to sex indirectly and fool people by his twisted ideas about God's plan.

It is important to create a safe space for girls to feel comfortable to have this conversation. The lesson should be more of a discussion than a presentation. Leave room for the girls to share their thoughts and feelings - and keep the main points in mind.

Activity

Write out the following questions on a giant piece of paper each (5 total) and put them around the room. Give colorful pens and post-it notes to the girls and have them go around to each poster and put their answers up. After they do that- go around and discuss the answers before jumping into the lesson.

1. Why don't I look like the women on TV and movies?
2. I like to wear nice clothes that attract guys. Is that ok?
3. Why did God give us sex? Is it controllable?
4. I want to know about sexual stuff and learn about it- is that ok? What should I do if I see a bad image?
5. Can I tell my father of confession everything during confession?

Lesson Outline

After a brief prayer and introduction- start answering the questions

1. Why don't I look like the women on TV and movies?
 - God has made each one of us in His image
 - We are fearfully and wonderfully made.
 - Must remember we need to be accepted by God
 - Mention how those on media spend years starving themselves and have teams helping them look good,
 - Our job is to focus on our inner beauty.
2. I like to wear nice clothes that attract guys. Is that ok?
 - Guys are more visual- that means they often look at appearance
 - There is nothing wrong with looking nice- but it is important to protect what God has given you.
 - You can look nice and stylish without dressing provocatively or wanting to get a guy's attention.
 - The guy who just pays attention to looks is not the kind of guy you want attention from.
 - Good guys share values of modesty and purity and worth waiting for.

3. Why did God give us sex? Is it controllable?

- Sex is an expression of love between two who have been united through the work of the Holy Spirit. (John 10:6-9)
- When experienced in the holy bond of marriage as God has designed it, it is good.
- Real love gives and not takes; first, you give your mind, heart, and soul and then last even the body to the person that you loved and bonded with through God in marriage. This is the completion of this love, this is the system that God has created for us in marriage.
- Yes, it is controllable, we are not animals. (Galatians 5:16-18)
- It's a choice, of course, we can control it by the power of the Holy Spirit we can overcome temptation, but it is not easy – stay away from the cliff! (Ephesians 5:26-27)

4. I want to know about sexual stuff and learn about it- is that ok? What should I do if I see a bad image?

- It is normal to be curious about your own body and other bodies.
- It is important though to understand that there are a time and place for everything.
- Talk to your mom or an older female servant regarding any questions you have.
- For bad images turn your eyes. You cannot keep the birds from flying but you can stop them from nesting on your head.

5. Can I tell my father of confession everything during confession?

- Yes, he is a representation of Christ and will not judge you.
- God and your father of confession will be sad for your struggle, not angry at you.
- Your father of confession has heard similar things from other people and he never judges you.
- He takes your sins and struggles and gives them to the Lord.
- Your father of confession will not remember your weaknesses and will NEVER disclose them.

Conclusion

- Purity is a process.
- Encourage the girls to have a relationship with God
- Create a safe space for them to be wanting to share with adults like a mom or a female servant.

Application

1. Flee temptation- when put in a situation, escape it. Why tempt it? Come up with examples with the girls.

2. Fences- build fences or “protection” around your heart, ears, heads feet, eyes, etc. Have them come up with examples.

3. Friends- be careful who your friends are.

4. Limit Free Time. Think up ideas on how they can keep busy together.

5. Father God- run to Him. Keep Him in your life.

Peer Pressure

Objective

To help 6th graders understand what peer pressure is and how to combat it.

Memory Verse

"Do not be deceived: Evil company corrupts good habits. Awake to righteousness, and do not sin; for some do not have the knowledge of God. I speak this to your shame." (1 Corinthians 15:33-34)

"Now when Peter had come to Antioch, I withstood him to his face, because he was to be blamed; for before certain men came from James, he would eat with the Gentiles; but when they came, he withdrew and separated himself, fearing those who were of the circumcision. And the rest of the Jews also played the hypocrite with him, so that even Barnabas was carried away with their hypocrisy." (Galatians 2:11-13)

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:2)

Introduction (Background Research for Servants)

Things to keep in mind as preparing for a lesson but not to be included in the lesson.

Read the various links and familiarize yourself with the various facts about peer pressure and realize that it is a serious subject. Even if the examples that the students are giving are not reasonable or seem insignificant- please remember that this is dramatic for them and seems like the end of the world. It is important to create a safe space for them to share their feelings and fears.

Lesson Outline

1. What is Peer Pressure? (Middle School Definition)

- Peer pressure is when we feel compelled to act a certain way because we want to fit in and be accepted by certain people
- Peer pressure is the powerful feeling of pressure from someone your own age that can push you toward making certain choices, good or bad.
- Peer pressure can take number of different forms, spoken and unspoken and can lead to risky, disapproved, or personally unwanted behavior

2. What are the pressures we face

- Unspoken Peer Pressure

The Huddle: group stands together talking or laughing, maybe looking at something you can't see, with their backs out to other

- 'The look: Kids who think they're cool give a look that means: "We're cool and you're not."
 - The Example: Popular kids simply buy or wear or do something, and because they set an example, others want to follow.
- Spoken Peer Pressure
 - Rejection: Threatening to leave someone out or end a friendship
 - Putdown: Insulting or calling names to make someone feel bad.
 - Rationalizing: Giving reasons to do something wrong or why it would be OK to do it.

3. How do we combat them?

Role Play Scenarios in separate groups

Activity

Split the students up into groups and have them act out a variation of this skit and let the other students guess which kind of pressure this is. Feel free to change the names or scenarios to make it more appropriate for your students.

Scenario A-Team Fans (don't tell other groups this "Trick" is "Rejection")

Characters: Josh, a boy who has just moved to the area. Several other boys who are local team fans
Setting: Outside the building before or after school or in the cafeteria during lunch

Action:

- Several boys are standing together discussing their favorite team. Josh walks past.
- One boy calls out to him and asks who his favorite team is.
- Josh answers with the name of another city team.
- All the boys laugh and turn away from Josh.
- Another boy calls out, "I guess you won't be at our (team name) party Sunday!" Josh walks away.

Scenario B - Substitute Teacher (don't tell other groups this "Trick" is "The Put Down")

Characters: Brianna - a polite, respectful middle school student. Other less respectful and somewhat rowdy students
Mr. /Ms. Morgan - substitute teacher

Setting: A middle school classroom

Action:

- Brianna enters the class, greets the substitute, sits down, and prepares to work.
- Other students enter, notice the substitute, and start spreading the word that there's a sub.
- The bell rings, and other students continue to stand and talk, etc.
- The substitute asks each of the other students to take their seats and quiet down for the morning announcements.
- Brianna remains seated quietly while other students continue laughing, messing around, and throwing paper wads, some directed at Brianna.
- Brianna ignores the disruption.
- One student calls Brianna a chicken and adds noises.

Scenario C – The Math Test (don't tell other groups this "Trick" is "Reasoning")

Characters: Pete, a kid who didn't study for a math test. Friends of Pete, who did not study but have a "cheat sheet" Mr. /Ms. Smith – the math teacher

Setting: A middle school classroom

Action:

- Pete comes into the classroom and hears the teacher says there's a math test.
- Pete mutters something about his mom's reaction to another failed math test.
- Friends overhear Pete and tell him not to worry; they've got him covered with the "cheat sheet."
- Pete hesitates and expresses concern about cheating and getting caught.
- Friends give him reasons why they think it's fine—such as everyone does it, they've done it before, and they didn't get caught.

Scenario D – The Party (don't tell other groups—this "Trick" is "The Huddle")

Characters: Katrina – a nice girl who likes a cool boy and wants to be popular. Mike – the cool boy that Katrina likes. Other cool kids

Setting: An end of school year party.

- Mike and other kids are gathered in a huddle around one student who is showing them a new music video on a portable media player. They are enjoying the video.
- Katrina walks in.
- A few in the group turn and briefly look at her and then at Mike. They don't acknowledge her and turn back to the video.
- Mike smiles at her and then gives his attention back to the video and the group.
- She approaches the group, but they don't turn to include her.

Scenario E – The Dance (don't tell other groups—this "Trick" is "The Look")

Characters: Diana a shy girl is wearing simple, plain clothing. Diana's shy best friend Mark also dressed in a plain way. Other "popular" students are wearing stylish jeans and casual shirts.

Setting: A school dance.

Action:

- The students in stylish clothes are dancing and laughing.
- Diana and Mark enter and stand apart, watching the others.
- One or two of the popular students notice Diana and Mark and give them “the look,” which can include looking them up and down, rolling their eyes, slightly shaking their heads in disapproval, and the like. They also nudge their friends—without saying anything—to look as well.

Conclusion

After each group acts out their skits, ask the students how the situation could have changed. How could they combat pressure? Write out the examples on a poster or big sheet where everyone can see it.

Remind the students that Christ is always with them. That they should always feel supported and be ok to approach a trusted adult to talk about their problems.

Application

Help the students come up with a plan that they can use to combat peer pressure by taking some of the examples they learned about and discuss how to react in the best way to

Introduction

Today, we are going to spend some time talking about the subject of dating. We'll also discuss singleness and friendships.

1. God's intention for us as Christ-followers.

- We begin today by talking about God's intention for us as Christ-followers God wants us to be not only physically pure but also pure in our motives, our minds, and our emotions.
- We read in (1 Peter 1:16) ""For it is written 'be holy because I am holy'"
- What does the word holy" mean? It means being dedicated to God and following His commands.
- Christ is our example in all things. We need to remember that our being which includes our physical, mental and emotional natures, belong to God and they are considered the temples of the Holy Spirit.
- We read in (1 Corinthians 6:19-20) "Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, who you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore, glorify God in your

body and in your spirit, which are God's

- Jesus Christ suffered for our sakes. God has a good plan for our lives, and He allows things to happen in a specific time. He does this for our own protection and our good.
- (Jeremiah 29:11) tells us "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you" says the Lord, 'thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope',
- God does not just try to take away the fun from us with His rules. He established them for our own benefit.

2. Biblical view on marriage.

- Let's review the Biblical perspective of marriage. Marriage was the first institution ever created. It was one of the first things ordained by God Himself.,
- (Genesis 2:24) says "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh".
- Marriage is also held in honor. In (Hebrews 13:4), we read "Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge."
- So, from both of these verses, we can see that marriage is God-given, honorable and holy. There is a concept, which states that the joy of intimacy is the reward of commitment. Basically, this means that when two people are committed to each other through marriage, they get to receive the benefits and happiness of closeness.
- God has provided sex as a gift to a husband and wife who are committed to each other.

3. History of dating.

- Did you realize that dating is a relatively new thing? Let's look at the history of dating. Here in America, before the 20th century, dating involved commitment and responsibility. The end goal of dating was marriage, not simply having fun.
- People only spent time alone with the opposite sex with the intention of considering this person as a potential future spouse. The turn of the century, with the invention of cars and movie theaters, the culture of dating began to change. It was looked upon differently and the purpose shifted from a serious time to evaluate another person, to an opportunity to show off and act cool by being with several different people.
- The idea of dating has evolved as Hollywood used it to promote their products and make money. Suddenly there was a lot of pressure for young people to compete with each other for dates with popular people and the ability to brag about how many people they were in relationships with.
- Unfortunately, our society followed Hollywood and began to conform to its ways.

4. Why shouldn't young people your age date now?

- There are many good reasons not to date at a young age. First, dating is a result of people being self-seeking or self-loving.

- Dating without any commitment only fulfills our personal needs or lusts by using others and not caring for them,
- It is a selfish act and does not teach us true love, which is selfless.
- We read in (1 Corinthians 13:5) that love does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil"
- Dating also distracts us from making good friends because of our focus on outward appearance and not genuine inner qualities.
- The end goal of dating is not marriage and therefore the relationship is useless and not beneficial. Dating at a young age also decreases the time period we are single, which is a time God uses to grow and build us.
- What is the point of singleness?
- But for the present time, God has given you a period of time to remain single.
- What is the point of singleness? Singleness is a season of our lives, is unmatched in opportunities for growth, learning,
- At this point in your lives, you are responsible for your schoolwork and maybe some household chores. But other than that, you are not working outside of the home or having to take care of many other responsibilities.
- Therefore, this is the best time for you to continue growing and learning, and to spend time serving others before you have the added responsibilities, which come when you are older.
- This is not the time to be focused on boyfriends and girlfriends. Dating at an early age causes people to look at things they don't have instead of enjoying life with God, friends, and family.
- God wants us to enjoy the season of life we are in now, rather than looking ahead and wishing we were older.
- He has made this time for us to develop and wants us to grow in patience and trust. In the right time, He will provide all things for us including our love lives. Being single has a special purpose to God. We read in 1 Corinthians 7:32 "But I want you to be without care. He who is unmarried cares for the things of the Lord-how he may please the Lord"
- Single people are able to dedicate more time and energy to serving God because they do not have a spouse and children to care for.
- Trusting God to take care of every part of our lives can be hard, but it is important.
- Rushing ahead of His timing can bring trouble. The right thing at the wrong time is the wrong thing
- As our memory verse explains, "To everything, there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven"". Just because something is good doesn't mean we should pursue it right now.
- We must remember that the right thing at the wrong time is the wrong thing. We should not chase after things that can harm us
- God has a perfect plan for your life. More than likely, that plan includes marriage, and if so, somewhere in this world, God has the right person for you. There is a time to pursue marriage, but the time is not now.

5. The story of Peter

- Let me tell you a story about a boy named Peter. He was an impatient boy who always dreamed about the future,
- One day as he was wandering in the forest, he saw an old woman who gave him a crystal ball. With it, he could skip any moment of his life and move ahead into the future. One day in school, Peter was bored in class and used the crystal ball to fast-forward the time. He continued to use it to skip large portions of his life.
- Many years later, at the end of his life, Peter realized the emptiness of such an existence because he robbed himself of life's richest moments and memories. He regretted using the crystal ball and was saddened about his impatience.
- He wondered how much of his life he had missed. Many times, we also want things to happen right now. But by wishing for this and focusing too much on the future, we forget about all the blessings we have right now. We may miss out on the unforgettable experiences and memories of today.
- Rather than concentrate so much on dating, we should focus on building friendships. It is very important to keep your relationships with the opposite gender out of the romantic zone
- In 1 Timothy 5:2, Saint Paul instructs his spiritual son, Timothy, to treat younger women as "sisters, with absolute purity". And in 2 Timothy 2:22, Saint Paul writes "Flee also youthful lusts, but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart"

6. How can you remain just friends with people from the opposite sex?

- First, understand the difference between friendship and intimacy. Remember, intimacy means closeness, and it is inappropriate for young people to become too close with others of the opposite sex.
- It is wise to set physical and emotional boundaries with others so that you are not tempted to become too close to them.
- Next, be inclusive, not exclusive. This means that you should include others in activities with the opposite sex rather than spend time alone together
- It is important that you do not isolate yourselves with another person but be in groups instead
- It's also important that you spend time with people of the same gender at your age because you will find that you have more in common with them.
- Finally, make sure to set aside some time for service. Serving along with others is a great way to know friends in a deeper way while doing something useful at the same time
- There is a lot of pressure from society on you to become involved with dating at your age.

7. Attitude changes, which can help you, avoid dating too early

1. So, let's think about five attitude changes, which can help you avoid dating too early
2. First, every relationship is an opportunity to model Christ's love. Relating to people the way Christ did, in a kind and compassionate way, will prevent us from becoming self-centered
3. Second, remember that your unmarried years are a gift from God. Enjoy this time of your life. Many times, young people can't wait to grow up because they think adults have a lot

of freedom. But adults have so much responsibility and little time to enjoy life.

4. Third, it is important to realize that you don't need to pursue a romantic relationship before you are ready for marriage. In fact, getting involved with someone at a young age will likely bring about heartache
5. Remember the concept we talked about before - the joy of intimacy is the reward of commitment. Without a commitment to marriage, you cannot experience the true joy of intimacy with another person.
6. When people are only dating, they have no rights over the other person. In marriage, however, a husband and wife become one body and therefore, this is a completely different relationship than simply dating.
7. Finally, it is critical to remember that you should avoid situations that could compromise the purity of your body or mind
8. True purity flees as fast and as far as it can from sin and compromising situations. Protect your heart from sinfulness. Proverbs 4:23 says "Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life.
9. There are a few final concepts to remember. Most likely, people who are dating at your age will not marry that person in the future. This is because teens have not yet fully developed mentally or emotionally, and therefore adolescents are not able to commit to another person.
10. Lifelong commitment requires a great deal of maturity and sacrifice. Finally, we cannot love as God loves and date as the world dates. God's love is about putting others first, but dating is really about pleasing ourselves.
